Royal Windsor Horse Show
Unaffiliated Show Jumping and Riding Test Championships 2010

Information Pack

This pack must be read in conjunction with the BRC Rules for Royal Windsor Horse Show Championships, the Competitor's Information Pack, the BRC Rule Book and the BRC Organiser's Guide.

Each club is entitled to run at least one qualifier for each of the six classes, which are:

- 1 Junior Riding Test
- 2 Senior Riding Test
- 3 Junior Novice Jumping
- 4 Senior Novice Jumping
- 5 Junior Intermediate Jumping
- 6 Senior Intermediate Jumping

These classes may be combined if necessary they may also be run in conjunction with another club show. One rider will qualify in each class to go forward to the second round at the appropriate area qualifier. Horse and rider combinations which have already qualified may not qualify twice. In the event of this happening, qualification passes to the next-placed combination.

- Competitors will be able to download entry forms from www.rwhs.co.uk or www.britishridingclubs.org.uk
- Organisers will be able to visit restricted-access pages on the RWHS website to download results forms and other supporting materials. They will be asked to upload details of their events to a diary kept on the same site. http://www.rwhs.co.uk/ARWHS_Organisers.html.
- Clubs which organise qualifiers will be offered one pair of RWHS tickets to use as they see fit.
- Qualifying rosettes will be awarded at Area Qualifiers (Round 2) competitions only. Rosettes for Area Qualifiers will be distributed by the BRC Office.
- A list of qualifying riders must be sent to the BRC office after the Area Qualifier (Round 2)
- Any prizes at Rounds 1 and 2 will be the responsibility of the organisers. There

will be a selection of memorabilia and prizes in kind for competitors in Rounds 3 and 4.

- Organisers of Round 1 classes must add £3 per rider to the local entry fee. This must be sent to the Hpower Office after the show. £2 will be kept by RWHS towards their organising and marketing expenses, £1 will be kept by BRC.
- Organisers of Round 2 classes must add £3 per rider to the local entry fee. This must be sent to the Hpower Office after the show. £1 will be kept by RWHS, £2 will be kept by BRC.
- The entry fees for Round 3 at Windsor will be advised and collected by RWHS. There will be no additional entry fee for Round 4.
- As this is the second year of the competition all Round 1 and Round 2 competitions must use the Riding Test as stipulated in the rules. All Round 1 and Round 2 show jumping qualifiers must run as a top score.
- Judges and course builders should be sought from the appropriate lists in the same way as for Winter and Summer Official Qualifiers.
- Organisers should liaise with their Area Representative for guidance in all matters relating to Rounds 1 and 2.

O4 - RULES FOR ROYAL WINDSOR HORSE SHOW CHAMPIONSHIPS

These competitions are open to Junior and Senior individual competitors. There will be the following:

- 1 a Riding Test Championship for Juniors and one for Seniors
- 2 a Novice Show Jumping Championship for Juniors and one for Seniors
- 3 an Intermediate Show Jumping Championship for Juniors and one for Seniors

BRC general rules and specific rules for riding test and show jumping will apply, with the following exceptions and amendments.

Each competition will have four rounds: Round 1: Club qualifier, Round 2: Area qualifier, Round 3: RWHS Final, Round 4: RWHS Championship. Rounds 3 & 4 will take place on the same day at Royal Windsor Horse Show.

Each BRC affiliated club is entitled to hold at least one qualifier (Round 1) for each competition.

Each BRC Area is entitled to hold one qualifier (Round 2) for each competition.

Horses and Ponies do not need to comply with equine influenza requirements for Round 1. However, those which qualify for Round 2 must have had at least the first Primary injection, at least 7 clear days prior to that competition. Those which qualify for Round 3 must comply fully with Rule G7.

O4R: RIDING TEST

Novice Riding Test 6 (2005) will be used for all rounds

O4R1 : ELIGIBILITY

O4R.1.1: Ponies/Horses

As for RT 6 & 7 in Appendix 2. 0-60 British Dressage Points allowed.
Downgrading as per rule D 1.1.3 may be applied

O4R.1.2: Riders

As for RT 6 & 7 in Appendix 3. Each rider must be a member of an affiliated BRC club in the local area to take part in Round 2 and above. Senior riders are those aged 18 or above on 1 January 2010.

O4R.2: ENTRIES AND NUMBERS TO QUALIFY

Riders who qualify for Round 2 will be given entry forms by the organiser of the show at which they qualify. A horse and rider combination may only qualify once for Round 2. Qualification will pass down the line to the next highest-placed combination which has not already qualified.

At all Round 2 qualifiers, one horse & rider combination will qualify for Round 3 in each competition. The RWHS organisers will supply entry forms for Round 3. The right is reserved to issue "wild card" invitations if numbers permit.

O4R.3: KEY DATES

All key dates are in the Omnibus Schedule and on the BRC web site.

O4R.4: DRESS, SADDLERY & TACK

O4S: SHOW JUMPING

Each round of the competition will take the form of a Top Score class.

O4S1 : ELIGIBILITY

O4S.1.1: Ponies/Horses

Novice classes: as for Junior and Senior Novice show jumping respectively in Appendix 2.

Intermediate classes: as for Senior Intermediate show jumping in Appendix 2.

Downgrading as per rule SJ 1.1.4 may be applied to both novice & intermediate sections.

Horses / ponies may only compete in one show jumping section.

Please note that as this is a 'stand alone' competition, horses & ponies may enter the standard official BRC show jumping competitions at a different level, and the second paragraph of rule G6.3 is not applicable.

O4S.1.2: Riders

As for show jumping in Appendix 3. In addition, riders in the Novice classes may not have won any money in BSJA competitions. In the Intermediate classes, riders may not

have won more than £175 in BSJA affiliated competitions in the last five years.

Each rider must be a member of an affiliated BRC club in the local area to take part in Round 2 and above.

O4S.2: ENTRIES AND NUMBERS TO QUALIFY

At all Round 2 qualifiers, one horse & rider combination will qualify for Round 3 in each competition. The RWHS organisers will supply entry forms for Round 3. The right is reserved to issue "wild card" invitations if numbers permit.

O4S.4: DRESS, SADDLERY & TACK

O4S.5: TOP SCORE RULES

BSJA Rule 273 applies unless stated otherwise.

O4S.5.1: The course will consist of 12 obstacles, each of which must be capable of being jumped in both directions. Fences 1 to 11 will be built to differing heights and each will carry a points value ranging from 20 to 120. The 12th fence will be a Joker fence worth 200 points.

O4S.5.2 Heights of fences

Class	Fence 1 (20 points)	Fence 11 (120 points)	Joker (200 points)
Novice	2' 0"	2' 9"	3' 0"
Intermediate	2' 6"	3' 3"	3' 6"

O4S.5.3 BSJA Rule 273 (modified)

O4S.5.3.1 The order of starting must be drawn.

O4S.5.3.2 Water jumps and combination obstacles are not allowed.

O4S.5.3.3 The time allowed is 60 seconds

O4S.5.3.4 The round starts when the competitor crosses the starting line in either direction.

O4S.5.3.5 The competitor chooses which obstacles to jump and may do so in either direction.

O4S.5.3.6 The competitor scores the number of points allotted to each obstacle, provided it is jumped clear. No points are scored for an obstacle knocked down.

O4S.5.3.7 An obstacle which is knocked down or displaced for any reason is not rebuilt. This includes the displacement of a lower element in the same vertical plane.

O4S.5.3.8 Each obstacle may be jumped twice to score. Jumping, voluntarily or otherwise, an obstacle for the third or subsequent time, or jumping or passing through an obstacle already knocked down or displaced, including the displacement of a lower element, does not incur elimination but scores no points.

O4S.5.3.9 Disobediences are not penalised since they decrease the time available in which to score. Following a disobedience, a competitor may either attempt the same obstacle again or proceed to the next obstacle of his choice. A second or subsequent disobedience does not incur elimination but the Judge may retire a competitor if it becomes apparent that repeated disobediences have destroyed all chance of the competitor featuring in the prize list.

O4S.5.3.10 The bell is rung as soon as the time allowed is reached. The competitor must then cross the finishing line in either direction to allow their time to be recorded. If they do not cross the finishing line, they are placed last of the competitors with the same number of points.

O4S.5.3.11 The number of points allotted to the last obstacle jumped clear will be included in the competitor's score provided the horse has already started to take off at the moment when the time allowed is reached.

O4S.5.3.12 Jumping an additional obstacle or obstacles after the bell has been rung is not penalised.

O4S.5.3.13 The Joker must be built as an upright (not a spread) obstacle. The Joker may be jumped twice to score. If jumped clear, 200 points are added to the score, but if the Joker is knocked down, 200 points are deducted from the score.

O4S.5.3.14 In the event of equality of points, time decides
