NOTES TO ALL COMPETITORS

Key Messages

As a special request this year, we ask that you do not bring any unnecessary vehicles as space across all areas of the event is very limited. Thank you in advance for your assistance in this matter.

Horse numbers are required to be shown **at all times** when a horse/pony is out of their stable or horsebox.

Please take careful note of conditions 17 (Dress), 23 (No Admission to Show Ring), 33 (Horseboxes / Caravans), 34 (Exercising and Working In), 35 and 36 (Abusive Behaviour). These are available in the [National Schedule](#) from page 67 onwards.

Competitor Communication

On the run up to the show, we will communicate any timetable changes or other important updates for National Competitors via email, to the Billing Contact email submitted at the time of making your entry on Showing Scene. Please let the Entries team know as soon as possible any changes to your contact details on the run up to the Show, so you do not miss any vital communications from the Entries team. Class 34 Coaching Marathon

Arrival instructions and Accreditation arrangements for Competitors participating in the Coaching Marathon will differ from the below. The Entries Secretary will email additional instructions directly to Competitors competing in this class.

Your E-Ticket allocation

New for this year, you will not have to allocate your e-tickets. These will be sent to the Billing Contact for the entry or the person who purchased the pass. Please screenshot the table of entries from your pass email and bring this as a photo on your phone, this should help streamline your collection of back numbers on the day.

Travelling to the Showground

Please follow the routing code on the yellow event traffic signage **RL Car Park** and you will then be directed to either the Horsebox Park or Owners' Car Park. The Postcode to follow is **SL4 6HX**. What3Words **///model.become.label**

Arriving at the Showground

The horsebox park will open daily at 5.30am and close one hour after the last class of the day finishes.

Any vehicles arriving outside of these hours will not be able to access either the Horsebox parking area or the Owners' Car Park. The HORSEBOX e-ticket is to be used for horseboxes and cars towing trailers only. Please only use OWNERS' CAR PARK e-tickets for separate cars.

Accreditation arrangements

Competitor, Groom and Owner accreditation for access to the show in 2026 will once again be in the form of wristbands. All competitors will receive their entitlement to free passes in the form of WB e-vouchers by email.

On arrival at the show, take your WB e-vouchers to the Accreditation Office near Victoria Bridge to **exchange for a wristlet**, this is also the point at which you should sign for and **collect your horse number(s)**. Please elect one member of your party to collect the bridle number on your first day of competition, so that you all know who should be in possession of the bridle number and reduce confusion on the day.

To receive your wristband, you must be in receipt of your own valid e-ticket. Please allow enough time to collect your wristband before entering the Showground to compete.

The **Victoria Bridge Wristband Exchange cabin** will be open daily between the following hours:

Additional competitor wristbands can be purchased on the day at the Victoria Bridge Wristband Exchange cabin (debit/credit card ONLY).

Exercise areas will only be available inside the Show Ground itself.

Passports and Vaccinations

Competitors **MUST** bring their horses passports with them to the show and ensure that their horse's vaccinations are up to date. Please refer to pages 11-12 of the schedule for vaccination rules. All horses may be checked and if there are any discrepancies, you will be refused access to the showground. There will be no exceptions.

Due to the increased risk of EHV infection, we shall be putting in place a strict biosecurity policy, including an increased frequency of examination of horses on arrival. We ask that owners / riders take their horse's / pony's temperature for the three days leading up to arrival at the Show, and on the morning of travel to ensure that it is not above 38.5 degrees. Please do not arrive on site if you are at all concerned about the health of your horse or pony before leaving home. If, upon arrival, you are concerned about anything, please speak to an official who will raise one of the Veterinary Team to assist you and make a decision about whether access to the site will be permitted. Please take great care with all your tack and anything associated with your horse/pony and ensure that there is no contact or possibility of cross contamination with other entrants and their belongings.

During the show, Catalogues can be purchased from various points around the showground, including just as you enter the Competitor Entrance at Victoria Bridge.

Show Jumping Classes / Declarations

COMPETITORS ARE REQUIRED TO DECLARE THEIR STARTERS FOR ALL BRITISH SHOWJUMPING COMPETITIONS (CLASSES 1 AND 2) BY 6.00 P.M. ON TUESDAY, 12TH MAY 2026.

Declarations can be made via email to entries@hpower.co.uk from Thursday, 7th May and will close on Tuesday, 12th May 2026 at 6.00pm.

Declarations, for Class 115 – Under 25 Jumping Competition, should be made by 6.00pm on Friday, 15th May 2026.

Any competitors with accepted entries who do not declare before this time will be replaced by those competitors who have selected to be included on a waiting list. For this reason, late declarations will not be accepted under any circumstances. This policy is intended to maximise the numbers of national jumping competitors able to benefit an opportunity to compete at the show.

No competitor will be allowed to jump Hors Concours.

All substitutions must be made at the time of declaration and must be made in accordance with British Showjumping Rule 79.4.

1. Substitutions will only be accepted in writing to the show secretary.

2. The horse substituted must be registered in the same ownership as that of the original entry and if so registered may be ridden by any rider qualified by the conditions of the competition to do so.

Additionally, an Authorised Agent may substitute any horse for which he has authority to act under Rule 33.09.3 for an entered horse for which he has authority to act, but in this case the horse substituted must be ridden by the rider already entered to ride the original entry.

5. No horse that is already entered in a particular competition may be substituted for another horse entered in the same competition except following a change of ownership as provided for in Rule 79.1.

6. When the ownership of a horse changes, the right to substitute in respect of any entries of that horse made prior to the receipt of Notice in Writing by the British Showjumping Office in accordance with Rules 22 & 23 remains with the previous owner or his Authorised Agent unless the previous owner gives Notice in Writing that the horse has been transferred with engagements in which case the right to substitute passes to the new owner or his Authorised Agent.

7. No horse may be substituted in any competition which is not fully eligible and qualified for that competition unless the schedule specifically states otherwise.

8. An authority to act is granted under Rule 33.09.3 to enable a bona fide trainer or rider, to whom an owner entrusts his horse, to enter that horse in competitions and to substitute as necessary for other horses in his charge. It is not to be used as a temporary expedient to enable an owner whose horse has not been accepted for entry in a particular competition to take over the entry of another owner who does not wish to compete.

The order of jumping in all classes will be drawn. All competitors must jump in this order. **Any competitor missing their turn will be disqualified by the Judges. This rule will be strictly enforced.**

Non-British Showjumping Classes requiring Competitors to declare can also declare via entries@hpower.co.uk:

- Class 80: Services Teams Jumping Competition: Must declare their starters by 7PM Thursday 14th May
- Class 123: Pony Club Show Jumping Competition: Must declare their starters by 6PM Friday 15th May

Miscellaneous

The Organisers of the Royal Windsor Horse Show strongly discourage horses being left unattended on horseboxes. Owners' leave horses unattended at their own risk, please refer to Condition 3. No horse / pony should be left unattended tied to a horsebox or trailer.

To get to the arenas, follow the horse-walk which will be signed. Please ensure you are at the correct arena 30 minutes before your class starts in case of small changes to class timings.

The PA system in the lorry park will only be used to announce upcoming class starts if the class has had its start time altered on the morning of competition.

All Competitors must provide the Show Organiser with a contact telephone number in case of an emergency.

In the event of a competitor not presenting for their class; all fees will be forfeited including, but not limited to, entry fees.

Mark sheets will not be available to view during the show. These will however be available to download on our website [here](#).

Any objections to potential irregularities or errors on mark sheets should be made within 24 hours of the marks being posted to the Royal Windsor Horse Show website.
